National

- Pakistan will be ready to go it alone when its \$6.7 billion three-year International Monetary Fund (IMF) programme ends in September, a senior IMF official said. Masood Ahmed. director of the IMF's Middle East and Central Asia department, told Reuters that substantial progress had been made in repairing the economy and that the government was right in saying it does not need another package.
- Moody's conclusions contained in its latest credit analysis titled "Government of Pakistan -B3 Stable", looks at the country's credit profile in terms of economic strength (assessed as moderate), institutional strength (very low), fiscal strength (very low) and susceptibility to event risk (high).
- Pakistan is eveing formal induction of the newly -launched JF-17B dual seat fighter jet by April 2017, the Pakistan Air Force (PAF) announced. Production of the first JF-17B was initiated by Pakistan and China during a joint ceremony at Chengdu Aerospace Corporation. The jet is set to make its maiden flight by the end of this year, the PAF spokesperson said.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

- Hazara University in <u>Mansehra</u> District has been closed for two days ahead of the prime minister's visit to the area on April 28. A notification to this regard was issued by Registrar Establishment-I announcing the closure of university on April 27-28.
- Unidentified assailants gunned down an assistant sub-inspector in an apparent incident of targeted killing in the limits of <u>Yakatot</u> police station, Peshawar. The police official identified as Qaiser Ali Shah, resident of Masozai area of Badbher locality, was deputed at the Phandu police station on the outskirts of the provincial capital.
- Unidentified gunmen opened fire in the area of Peshawar, killing 2 and injuring 2 others.
 Assailants managed to escape after the attack, police registered a case and started investigation.
- An anti-terrorism court convicted two persons for demanding extortion from a lawyer and sentenced them to 10 years rigorous imprisonment each. ATC Judge Abdur Rauf Khan pronounced that the prosecution had proved its case against the two accused persons named Ghaniur Rehman, resident of Mohmand Agency, and Abdur Rehman of Regi area in Peshawar.

- FIA conducted raid in city of Lahore and arrested an alleged accused involved in money laundering.
- A Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) team has arrested a Gepco official for embezzling about Rs 6.91 million in the billing section from <u>Gujranwala</u>.
- A schoolteacher was kidnapped from his home near Government Postgraduate College Asghar Mall, Rawalpindi, the police said. However, in the FIR lodged with Banni police, the father of the victim claimed that his son was taken away by masked men in black clothes from his home
- The abducted lady traffic warden Afra was recovered in unconscious state from Ring Road Lahore. The lady warden was allegedly abducted two days ago, while going home after performing her duty. The police have registered an abduction case on complaint of her sister and arrested her brother in-law.

Sindh

- Police conducted search operation in Awami Colony, Karachi and arrested 2 criminals, police also recovered weapons and ammunition.
- A young man was shot dead while a passer-by sustained a bullet wound in an attack on a flower shop in <u>Malir</u>, Karachi. During investigation, the police claimed to have found traces of a monetary dispute between the tenant and land owner.
- In <u>Orangi Town</u>, a young man stabbed his teenage sister to death. "The arrested suspect told the police that he saw his sister talking to a youngster on the doorstep of their home," said Mominabad police station SHO Inspector Sabir Khattak.

International

- Pakistan and Russia are in talks on sales of helicopters, air defence systems and modernised tanks, Defence Minister Khawaja Asif told Russian media. Pakistan is eyeing to modernise its Air Force, the minister said on the sidelines of the fifth Moscow Conference on International Security.
- An ancient stone sculpture of Buddha's footprints that was smuggled into the United States and had been expected to sell for more than \$1 million was returned to the government of Pakistan.
 The piece, called a Buddhapada, was taken from Swat, a region rich in Buddhist history decades ago. It was returned by New York prosecutors to Pakistani Deputy Chief of Mission.
- India has activated a dozen 'laser walls' along the border with Pakistan in Punjab to check crossborder infiltration into its territory and plug the porous riverine and treacherous terrain. Eight such intrusion detection systems were made operational along the many vulnerable and sensitive areas of the international border, a senior official of the Indian Border Security Force (BSF) said.
- UN chief Ban Ki-moon called for the US, China and other nuclear-armed states to end the "madness" of atomic testing by finally ratifying the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty, which turns 20 this year. "I call on remaining states, the eight remaining states, to sign and ratify the treaty without further delay," Ban said in Vienna at an event marking the anniversary.
