National

- Interior Minister Chaudhry Nisar Ali Khan has said terrorism has become a global issue and coordinated efforts are needed to curb this menace. He was speaking at the International Institute of Strategic Studies in London. The minister asked the West not to impose any solution to handle terrorism in South Asia.
- Pakistan conveyed its 'serious concerns' to India over its spy agency's involvement in subversive activities in Balochistan and Karachi, as talks between the foreign secretaries of the two arch-rivals in New Delhi failed to break the stalemate in the bilateral dialogues.

Islamabad

- A cleric of Lal Masjid and 54 other people were arrested during an operation jointly conducted by security agencies, Rangers and the capital police in the rural area of the capital. The police said Amir Siddiqi, the *naib khateeb* of Lal Masjid, was taken into custody after three Kalashnikovs were recovered from his possession during the search of a religious seminary located near Bhara Kahu police station. However, the cleric was later released.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

- An alleged facilitator of a commander of the militant Islamic State (IS) group in Afghanistan was arrested from Regi Lalma area, police said. The suspect, Musa, has close links with Afghanistan-based Abdullah alias Cheeta, a commander of Daesh (the Arabic acronym for IS), said Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) Saifullah as he produced the suspect before media.
- Japanese envoy Takashi Kurai has said that his country will continue to provide financial assistance to Pakistan to impart quality education to youngsters, especially girls. He visited Shewa village, [Swat](#) to inaugurate a middle school for girls, which is constructed with the financial assistance of the Japanese government.
- Peshawar customs collector Qurban Ali Khan inaugurated a passenger facilitation centre at [Torkham](#). At the centre, the people traveling to and from Afghanistan will produce valid travel documents and luggage for checking to get permission to continue with the journey. The government has made it mandatory for all such passengers to produce valid passport from May 1.
- Two khasadar officials were injured in an improvised explosive device blast in Safi tehsil of [Mohmand Agency](#), officials said. Tehsildar Miraj Khan said khasadar personnel were on a routine patrol in Chamarkand area when an IED exploded resulting in injuries to two personnel.
- Police and security forces conducted operation in area of Saddar, [Banu](#). Arrested several suspects from different premises.

Punjab

- Law enforcement agencies concluded Operation Zarb-e-Ahan on 27th day of its launch as, according to police sources, most of the criminals in Kachcha Jamal and Kachcha Moro areas in sub-district Rohan of district [Rajanpur](#) have either been arrested or fled from the area. The curfew has ended and army troops have also left the area after completing the search operation.
- Unidentified gunmen opened fire at a vehicle on Fatimah Jinnah Road, [Sargodha](#) killing 1 man and injuring 3 individuals including children. Police registered a case and investigating the motive behind the killing.
- Police conducted search operation in the area of Attock, during this operation police took 3 Afghan nationals into custody who were living illegally in Pakistan.
- FIA raided a premises in [Jhelum](#) and arrested human trafficker. Several passports, fake visas and other documents have been recovered.
- A lady traffic warden was allegedly kidnapped while returning from duty, police official said. Police have registered a case on the request of victim's sister against the brother-in-law of the missing traffic warden, said investigation in-charge Inspector Ghulam Saqlain.
- Police conducted search operation in Iqbal Town, Lahore and arrested 11 suspects.
- Two dacoits have been killed while other two managed to escape in exchange of fire with police in the area of [Phool Nagar](#), Kasur.

Sindh

- Pakistan Rangers released a list of 60 suspects under its detention for 90 days and allowed their families to meet them under the jail manual guidelines in a move that was welcomed by the MQM, calling it the constitutional and legal rights of the people to meet their loved ones even if they were facing charges of heinous crimes.
- "During the campaign concluded last week, around 7,000 volunteers and teams succeeded to vaccinate 95pc of the target in Karachi," officials of the emergency operations centre (EOC) for polio in Sindh told a meeting presided over by Karachi commissioner Asif Hyder Shah.
- Pakistan Fruit and Vegetable Exporters, Importers and Merchant Association (PFVA) said that armed gangs in Sindh, apparently enjoying political support, have started occupying mango orchards that are already booked by exporters. "We have written a letter to the Trade Development Authority of Pakistan (TDAP) to immediately look in to the matter," according to a PFVA press release.
- Police conducted operation in [Saudabad](#), Karachi and arrested wanted criminal Aslam alias Ganja from the premises. The arrested criminal was wanted in many cases.
- Unidentified attackers threw hand grenade, resultantly injuring 2 individuals in the area of Dubai Chowk, Lyari.
- Two young suspects, who were arrested after recovery of an eight-year-old girl's body from their custody, were booked for alleged rape and murder of five young girls case. They were produced in a [Tando Allahyar](#) court, which remanded them into the custody of Chambarr police for two days.

Balochistan

- Under the political reconciliation scheme launched in Balochistan, 1,025 militants belonging to various proscribed outfits, have surrendered before the provincial government during the past year. Among the surrendered militants are a dozen key militant commanders, who have laid down their arms before provincial officials, said Secretary Home and Tribal Affairs, Akbar Hussain Durrani.
- Iranian security forces have handed over 55 Pakistani nationals to Levies Force on Pakistan-Iran border in Taftan area of [Chagai](#) district. Levies official said that the Pakistani workers were apprehended from different parts of Iran because they had come to the country without travelling documents.
- A suspected militant was killed and another arrested during a gunfight with security forces in [Panigur](#). Security personnel claimed to have seized arms and ammunition from the scene of the clash. Security officials said a raid was carried out in the area after receiving information about the presence of militants there.

International

- "Pakistan's ambassador to Kabul, Abrar Hussain, was summoned to the Foreign Ministry and a formal protest was lodged over cross-border shelling by the Pakistani forces," the Tolo News broadcaster reported.
- In a major breakthrough in Panama Papers case, the International Consortium of Investigative Journalists (ICIJ) has announced it will reveal a "searchable database" with information on over 200,000 offshore entities, including names of over 200 Pakistanis, on May 9.
- Indian authorities have imposed a curfew and other restrictions in Srinagar in order to prevent people offering funeral prayers in absentia for deceased Jammu Kashmir Liberation Front (JKLF) supreme head Amanullah Khan.
- Air strikes on rebel-held areas of Syria's second city Aleppo and a town to its west have killed at least 19 people, emergency workers said. The strikes are the latest in a surge of violence in and around the city that has severely tested a February 27 ceasefire.
