Daily Security Report

National

- Chief of Army Staff Gen Raheel Sharif arrived in the Jordanian capital and met senior members of the royal family and high-ups of Jordanian armed forces. At an exclusive ceremony, Gen Sharif was awarded the most prestigious Jordanian medal of merit for "displaying remarkable courage in leading Pakistan Army in the face of multiple threats", said a statement issued by ISPR.
- The Foreign office spokesman Nafees Zakaria clarified that Pakistan is making serious efforts for peace in Afghanistan but the country alone is not responsible to bring Afghan Taliban on table for dialogue. He also said that Pakistan condemns terrorism in all forms and does not differentiate between terrorist groups, adding that peace in Afghanistan is in best interest of Pakistan.
- Foreign Office spokesman Nafees Zakaria said during the meeting between the Indo-Pak foreign secretaries on the sidelines of the Heart of Asia Conference in New Delhi, Foreign Secretary Aizaz Chaudhry underscored Pakistan's commitment to ensure friendly relations with all its neighbours, including India.

 Minister for Interior, Chaudhary Nisar Ali Khan will hold meeting with his British counterpart, Theresa May in London to discuss situation relating to regional security. He will also discuss matters relating to bilateral Pak-United Kingdom ties and ways and means to further strengthen them.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

- Religious leaders condemned the killing of KP assembly member Sardar Soran Singh and asked the government to announce 'Tamgha-i-Imtiaz' for the slain lawmaker. The speakers expressed their resolve to initiate a campaign against terrorism, extremism, sectarian violence and corruption.
- Nearly 300,000 Temporarily Displaced Persons (TDPs) have safely returned to their homes so far. According to details, 86,500 TDPs have returned to Khyber Agency, 78,000 returned to Bajaur, 37,000 to <u>North Waziristan</u> Agency, 60,000 to <u>Mohmand</u>, 22,200 Orakzai and 6,000 to Kurrum agency. Official sources said this phase of TDPs' return will be completed by mid of May.
- Unknown persons gunned down a retired official of the Pakistan Air Force along with his daughter-in-law in <u>Gulbahar</u> area, Peshawar. According to police, deceased Sabir Hussain and his daughter-in-law, a doctor by profession, were going in a motorcar when unknown armed men shot them dead. Police have registered an FIR and started investigation.
- An earthquake measuring 5.8 on the Richter scale rocked different parts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa on early Monday morning. The tremor was felt in Peshawar, Swat, Abbottabad, <u>Chitral</u>, Malakand, <u>Buner</u>, Shangla, Swabi, <u>Lower Dir</u> and their surrounding areas. No loss of life was reported.

Punjab

- The hanging of a mass murderer in Adiala Jail was deferred for the second time. The jail official said that the execution of retired Capt Zafar Iqbal was postponed till further orders on Monday evening on the directions of the district and session court.
- In the incident of firing, a man injured his mother-in-law over the property dispute, in the area of <u>Shadbaagh</u>, Lahore. The victim is admitted to the hospital and in a critical condition, police have registered a case against the accused.
- Police conducted a raid in the area of <u>Model Town</u>, Lahore and arrested 10 alleged drug dealers. Drugs and liquor worth more than half a million have been recovered from the premises.
- In the incident of robbery in the area of <u>Faisal Town</u>, Lahore dacoits took away cash and valuables worth almost a million rupees from the house.
- An old man committed suicide by consuming pesticides in the area of Luton Road, Lahore. According to police the deceased was hopeless about his terminal illness.
- Thirty two years old man committed suicide by shooting himself in head in the area of North Cantonment, Lahore. Deceased was a resident of <u>Khushab</u>, however police could not ascertained the reason of suicide.

Sindh

- Pakistan Rangers Sindh claimed to have arrested a target killer associated with MQM during a search operation in Karachi's <u>Azizabad</u>. "Mohammad Kashif alias David, who belongs to MQM, is a most wanted criminal in multiple targeted killing and terrorism incidents," Rangers official Colonel Faisal told media representatives.
- CTD arrested three alleged hit-men belonging to a political party and seized huge quantity of arms and ammunition from their custody in North Karachi, according to the SSP CTD Intelligence Wing, Amir Farooqi.
- Railway Police and law enforcement agencies conducted a raid at Akbar Bugti Express in Jacobabad and recovered a huge cache of foreign-made automatic weapons and arrested an accused. The train was going to Quetta from Peshawar.
- One man killed while other injured in the incident of firing by unidentified gunmen in the area of Akhtar Colony, Karachi.
- The terrorist of political party's militant wing has been sentenced to 33 years of prison by the Anti Terrorism Court in Karachi.
- A man torched his wife to death over a minor domestic dispute in the area of <u>Sukkur</u>. Police have arrested the accused and registered a case against him.

International

- Iran is holding talks with Russia to sell it about 40 tonnes of heavy water from its nuclear
 program, Iran's deputy foreign minister was quoted as saying by the Fars news agency. Under
 last year's landmark nuclear deal between Iran and world powers, Tehran is responsible for
 reducing its stock of heavy water which is a component of making nuclear weapons and
 producing nuclear energy.
- Prince Sultan Bin Salman, President of Saudi Commission for Tourism and National Heritage, has launched the Post-Umrah Programme, an initiative which allows Umrah pilgrims to convert their visas into tourist visas.
- Syria's war has destroyed agricultural infrastructure and fractured the state system that provides farmers with seeds and buys their crops, deepening a humanitarian crisis in a country struggling to produce enough grain to feed its people. The country's shortage of its main staple wheat is worsening. The area of land sown with the cereal - used to make bread - and with barley has fallen again this year, the U.N. Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) told Reuters.
- Lawmakers have moved a bipartisan bill in the House of Representatives, expressing serious reservations over US arms sales to Saudi Arabia and support for the Saudi operation in Yemen. The joint bill, moved by Democrat Ted Lieu and Republican Ted Yoho during the weekend, is a companion to a similar legislation moved in the Senate last month.
- NATO is ten weeks away from launching a naval mission off Libya as part of a US-backed plan to close the Western Mediterranean migrant route to Europe, officials said. The advanced state of preparations for the operation was revealed by Italian Defence Minister Roberta Pinotti as leaders of the US, Britain, France, Germany and Italy met in Germany. The 6,000-strong force will be charged primarily with training up Libyan security forces but will be able to call on US warplanes and drones based in Italy for its protection if required.
