- Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif has said the matters related to inquiry into Panama leaks has been entrusted to the Chief Justice of Pakistan and if he amends the terms of reference, the government will accept it.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

- SP Rural Shakirullah Bangash told media that police acted on a tip-off and stopped a suspect vehicle near <u>Tarnab</u>, GT Road. Upon checking, two hand-grenades, 5 kg explosive material, safety fuse along with handbill with hate material were recovered. Three alleged terrorists were also arrested and sent to undisclosed location for investigation.
- Capital city police conducted search operations in various areas of the city and arrested 113 suspects, also recovered large cache of weapons and drugs.
- The charred body of a teenage girl was found in a torched Suzuki van in Donga Gali, in Abbottabad district. According to police, the body was tied to the seat of the vehicle, which was parked at a bus stop in Makol village of Donga Gali.

Punjab

- The government has awarded a contract to install 10,000 surveillance cameras in Lahore to a Chinese company. A memorandum of understanding (MoU) has been signed between the Punjab Safe Cities Authority and Huawei.
- The Rawalpindi Forest Department has constituted a special mobile force to launch a crackdown on timber mafia cutting trees forests of Margalla Hills including Murree, Ghora Galli, Lehtrar, Kotli Satiyan, Punjar and Kahota. The special force has been equipped with latest arms, wireless sets vehicles and guards. The teams will work in shifts.
- Three labourers, asleep on a footpath in Madina Town were stabbed to death by unidentified persons in Faisalabad. The police, however, termed the incident result of old enmity.
- Special Judge Anti Corruption in Faisalabad sentenced a *Patwari* to 16 years in prison and fined him Rs. 1 million over grabbing a piece of land owned by an expatriate through forgery.
- Mumtaz Mai and her three children were attacked by an unknown assailant in Chak Sardarpur area while they were sleeping. The four were admitted to the burn unit at Nishtar Hospital with minor injuries.

Sindh

- A suspected militant belonging to the banned Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan, who was allegedly involved in a bomb attack on a Muttahida Qaumi Movement election office, was killed in an encounter in Orangi Town in which two policemen and a passerby also suffered injuries, police officials said.
- One man got severely injured by knife attack in the area of Orangi Town.
- A target killer belonging to Lyari gang has been sentenced to death, along with a fine of Rs. 100,000 by the ATC Karachi. The accused was involved in many target killings, including a police officer.

International

- The case of the jailed the Pakistani doctor who helped CIA hunt down Osama bin Laden resurfaced at the US State Department briefing, after Republican presidential front-runner Donald Trump claimed that if elected he would get him freed within "two minutes".
- Russian President Vladmir Putin has turned down Islamabad's invitation to visit Pakistan and inaugurate a key pipeline project, a report carried by Indian news agency ANI. Providing a reason for turning down the invitation, Moscow explained that there was not enough 'substance' in this trip, ANI news agency reported.
- Government forces have launched operations against the Taliban in 18 provinces of Afghanistan as fighting has intensified since the start of the insurgents' spring offensive this month, the ministry of defence said. Eighty anti-government fighters, including nine from Islamic State have been killed over the past 24 hours in the east, while six soldiers have been killed, a defence ministry statement said.
- One of the most senior Taliban figures in the group's Quetta Council has died of cancer, reportedly in a specialised cancer hospital. The Taliban group confirmed that Abdullah Gul Rayan died of cancer but did not elaborate further regarding his death and the location where he died. Reported by Afghan news agency Khamaa Press.
- Delegates from Germany's anti-immigration party Alternative for Germany (AfD) backed an election manifesto that says Islam is not compatible with the country's constitution and calls for a ban on minarets and the burga.
- Two car bombs claimed by the militant Islamic State (IS) group killed at least 14 people and wounded 37 others in the centre of the southern Iraqi city of Samawa. The first blast was near a local government building and the second one about 60 metres away at a bus station, police sources said.
- A Muslim prayer hall in the French island of Corsica was ravaged by fire, prosecutors said was
 probably a criminal attack. The blaze occurred just months after the island, popular with tourists
 for its turquoise waters and picturesque mountains, was rocked by anti-Arab riots over
 Christmas.
