Daily Security Report

National

- Army top brass approved a comprehensive plan to carry out combing operations across the country to pre-empt potential sleeper cells and terrorists hideouts. The plan approved at the Corps Commanders Conference chaired by Chief of Army Staff General Raheel Sharif would simultaneously aim at enhancing the reach of local and provincial Law Enforcement Agencies. (ISPR)
- In a meeting with Special Assistant to the Prime Minister on Foreign Affairs, Tariq Fatemi, delegation members Kristen Marquardt and Sajit Gandhi reiterated US efforts to strengthen Pakistan's counter-terrorism capacity and said that continued cooperation was a testimony to the strength of Pak-US bilateral relations.
- Pakistan will acquire F-16s from elsewhere if the United States does not arrange funding for the sale, said Sartaj Aziz, the Prime Minister's adviser on foreign affairs.

Islamabad

- Interior Minister Chaudhry Nisar Ali Khan asserted that "the fate of Shakeel Afridi will only be decided by Pakistani courts".
- Interior Minister Chaudhry Nisar Ali Khan has directed heads of Nadra and Passport Office to ensure that all people living in the country and abroad get CNICs and passports without delay.
- Real estate agents held a protest at the Capital Development Authority's (CDA) office, alleging that the corruption in the civic agency was affecting their business.

Punjab

- Inspector General of Punjab Police chaired a high level meeting to discuss training of 12,000 personnel in Special Units for the protection of Chinese engineers.
- At least 120 people, including women and children were hospitalized after they drank substandard milk in Moradabad area of <u>Faisalabad</u>. The police have registered a case against the shopkeeper and started investigation.
- Police recovered bullet riddled and tortured body of a girl. Police said that after being spotted by dwellers of the area, the girl's body was taken into custody from agricultural fields near Chattha Colony, in Ferozwala area of district <u>Sheikhupura</u>.
- Police conducted raid in Kareem Block, Lahore and arrested 9 suspects.
- Two groups of landlords exchanged fire, killing 2 individuals in the area of <u>Qila Deedar Singh</u>, Gujranwala.
- A Christian woman has moved to a court, seeking protection from two men threatening to kill her and her husband. She has also said that the Model Town SHO is harassing her at the behest of the suspects.

Balochistan

- Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif launched the state-run National Health Programme (NHP) benefiting about 76,000 families in four districts of Balochistan. Underprivileged residents of Quetta, Kech, Loralai and Lasbela will benefit from the government-funded program.
- Five police personnel were wounded in an improvised explosive device (IED) blast in Quetta's Eastern Bypass area. A contingent of police were patrolling the area in a mobile van when they were targeted through an IED, police said.
- Security agencies conducted search operation in the area of <u>Harnai</u> and arrested 2 alleged militants affiliated with banned organization.

International

- US President Barack Obama has said that he wanted to send Navy SEALs into Pakistan 'fairly early' to get Osama but waited until all members of his team had a chance to have their say. President Obama disclosed this in a lengthy interview he gave to CNN on the fifth anniversary of the May 2, 2011 raid at bin Laden's compound in Abbottabad.
- The US State Department has said that Pakistan will have to pay from its own funds if it wants to buy F-16 fighter jets. Pakistan had earlier reached an understanding with the US for buying eight F-16 planes. Under the deal, Pakistan was required to pay about \$270m from its national funds. The US was supposed to provide the rest from its Foreign Military Financing (FMF) fund.
- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in Frankfurt to co-finance mutually-agreed projects. Both the lenders have selected Pakistan as the destination for a \$300 million collective project to construct a road in Punjab from Shorkot to Khanewal.
- Iran has passed a law allowing the government to grant citizenship to the families of foreigners killed while fighting for the Islamic republic, the official IRNA news agency reported. The law could apply to "volunteers" from Afghanistan and Pakistan who are fighting in Syria and Iraq against militants, including the militant Islamic State (IS) group and AI Qaeda's Syrian franchise, AI-Nusra Front.
- Two lawsuits filed in California claim that Muslim women were discriminated against in separate incidents because of their religion and for wearing the hijab.
- The head of US Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), John Brennan, has said that there is "no evidence" indicating that Saudi Arabia gave backing to Al Qaeda for the Sept 11, 2001, terrorist attacks on New York and Washington. In an interview on NBC news he said speculation that the Saudis were involved, as some in Congress have charged, was not "corroborated, not vetted, and not deemed to be accurate".
