- The capital remains on 'high alert' following a possible terrorist threat to the city, with the Red Zone declared a prime target. Alert issued by security agencies says that militants may target sensitive locations in the Red Zone, particularly two hotels. Officials said they were informed that in addition to the Red Zone, there may also be an attack on an educational institute.
- Islamabad police were ordered to take action against PPP leader Nayyar Hussain Bokhari and his bodyguard after one of them allegedly slapped a security official.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

- The security forces and civil administration officials asked the <u>Khyber Agency</u> tribesmen to expel Afghan citizens from their areas as most of them were involved in terror activities to sabotage peace in Pakistan. This was stated by Swat Scouts Commandant Colonel Naeemullah and assistant political agent of Jamrud Saiful Islam while speaking to a joint Jirga of Shalmani, Mulagori and Kokikhel elders held at Swat Scouts camp in Jamrud Pump House.
- Two unidentified assailants opened fire and killed the police officer in the area of Peshawar. The
 assailants escaped on motorbike after killing the officer.
- The CTD police apprehended two militants of a banned outfit from Peshawar. They were arrested from University Road on a tip-off, while distributing objectionable pamphlets information.
- <u>Mirpur</u> police busted an inter-provincial dacoit gang and arrested all the five accused involved in the recent broad-day dacoity in a local currency exchange shop in Mirpur, police said.

Punjab

- The Regional Police Officers (RPOs) conference was held in Lahore, it was decided to hand over affairs of all the elements enlisted under Fourth Schedule of the Anti-Terrorism Act in the province to the Counter Terrorism Department (CTD).
- A Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) was arrested for the alleged rape of a minor girl in Kahna area of Lahore, police said. A First-Information Report was filed against the DSP after the girl accused the official of raping her.
- Two men and a woman belonging to a banned sectarian organisation and a member of a law enforcement agency were killed in a clash in Pind Ghakhara village, about 6 km from Taxila.
- Police arrested a man for having a brawl with the National Database and Registration Authority (NADRA) officials in Gulberg, Lahore.
- The traffic police authority Faisalabad recovered more than Rs 9 million from over 100 traffic wardens and inspectors who embezzled millions of rupees taking an advantage of the flawed challan system.
- A group of 38 Pakistanis deported by Greek authorities arrived Pakistan. Soon after their arrival, they were shifted to the Federal Investigation Agency's (FIA) anti-human trafficking cell for further investigation.

Sindh

- "There are 2,200 CCTV cameras in the city, which were installed by the City District Government, Karachi Police and the IT Department Sindh, out of which half are not working", DIG Administration Karachi Police Ghulam Sarwar Jamali told the Senate body.
- The Pakistan Maritime Security Agency (PMSA) has intercepted a boat in the open sea and arrested six smugglers with 12,400 bottles/cans of high quality liquor, estimated to be worth Rs 60 million
- Dozens of armed persons attacked the office of XEN office Mirpurkhas and ransacked the office furniture and doors. They also damaged the official documents and issued threats of dire consequences to the staff.

International

- The United States has 'absolutely no intention' of diminishing its relationship with Pakistan in any
 way, says the US State Department. The department's spokesman refused to criticise Pakistan
 for saying that it would look for other options if a deal for buying eight F-16 fighter jets from the
 United States fails.
- The Indian Intelligence Bureau (IB) and Delhi Police's special cell have claimed to detain 12
 Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) members from Delhi and Deoband in Uttar Pradesh, Indian media
 reported, citing police sources.
- Bangladesh's Supreme Court upheld the death sentence of top religious party leader Motiur Rahman Nizami for war crimes, paving the way for his execution within days. Nizami, head of Bangladesh's biggest religious party Jamaat-e-Islami, was convicted of murder, rape and orchestrating the killing of intellectuals in 1971.
