National

- The Foreign Office will engage the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) for protecting itself from hackers following cyber attacks over the past 18 months. The foreign ministry has sought an allocation of Rs. 80 million in the next fiscal year's budget for bolstering cybersecurity and securing its communications with the country's missions overseas. The job will be done by "our premier security agency", the official said in a reference to ISI.
- The government has appointed a noted industrialist and a member of the board of directors of Pakistan International Airlines, Muhammad Azam Saigol, as chairman of the national flag carrier.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

- Two people arrested in connection with the assassination of Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaf (PTI) minority MPA Soran Singh confessed to the murder in court.
- Unidentified motorbike riders opened fire and killed 2 lawyers in the area of Dogar road, <u>Dera Ismail Khan.</u>
- Security in <u>Bajaur Agency</u> was put on high alert after information that militants would try to carry out terrorist activities at three different places in Khar, local people and sources said. However, the sources didn't specify the places where militants might strike.
- According to Police, a 22-year-old youth belonging to Mustajapan-deh locality of <u>Chitral</u> consumed poisonous pills, resultantly he expired before he could be shifted to hospital.
- Police arrested 14 suspects from Abbottabad, involved in the murder of Ambreen Bibi whose charred body was recovered from a vehicle few days ago.

Punjab

- The National Accountability Bureau (NAB) has arrested former Pepco managing director Tahir Basharat Cheema on accusation of illegal appointments in Gujranwala Electric Supply Company (Gepco) during his tenure and misuse of authority.
- The Counter-Terrorism Department personnel gunned down eight terrorists while four other managed to escape on Shargpur Road near village Hoayki in Sheikhupura.
- A four-member gang of criminals has been arrested in Rawalpindi. The gang is wanted by police for involvement in several criminal acts.
- Police said that members of a rival group of people tortured women of their opponent group over property dispute in village 249-EB, <u>Vehari</u>. Resultantly, four women were injured and shifted to District Headquarters (DHQ) Hospital for treatment while the culprits managed to escape.
- Four armed men opened indiscriminate fire at AQ College bus, near Dawood Khel area of <u>Mianwali</u> and fled from the scene of crime. The police traced and arrested two attackers, while their two accomplices are still on the run.
- Police arrested a man who abducted an eight year old girl and raped her in Dinpura area of <u>Sialkot</u>. Police rescued the girl in critical condition and registered a case against the culprit.

- Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif, inaugurated the 393-kilometre-long Sukkur-Multan motorway.
- An Accountability Court indicted former Federal Petroleum Minister Dr. Asim Hussain on corruption charges on a reference pertaining to Rs. 462 billion funds.
- The law enforcement agencies conducted an operation in Karachi's District Central and arrested two terrorists involved in attacks on traffic police officials.
- An under custody alleged terrorist confessed to collecting hides, zakat, fitra and charity from the
 posh Defence Housing Authority, Karachi for Al-Qaeda. According to police sources, the
 accused was arrested in a search operation in Preedy Police Station jurisdiction some days
 back.

Balochistan

- The National Accountability Bureau (NAB) arrested Balochistan Finance Secretary Mushtaq Ahmed Raisani in a raid at his office in the civil secretariat. Raisani has been accused of embezzling billions of rupees from local government development funds, a senior NAB official said.
- The dead bodies of four girls, aged between two and ten, were recovered from a water tank in Faizabad area adjacent to <u>Quetta's airport road</u>, said police officials. The girls' father, Mehmood Khan, alleged that his daughters were initially poisoned by their mother and then thrown into a water tank.

International

- Pakistan, Indonesia, the Palestinian territories, Bangladesh, and Nepal attract the highest rates
 of attempted malware attacks, according to Microsoft Corp. Countries that attracted the fewest
 include Japan, Finland, Norway and Sweden, reveals the Microsoft Security Intelligence (MSI)
 report Volume 20 for the second half of 2015.
- Afghan President Ashraf Ghani has appointed a new acting defence minister to replace Masoom Stanekzai, a loyalist ally whom he has shifted to lead the main intelligence agency, the National Directorate of Security (NDS).
- Saudi police shot dead two suspected terrorists and two others blew themselves up during a raid near the holy city of Makkah, the interior ministry said.
- Twenty-eight people including women and children have been killed and fifty other wounded during air strikes in a displaced persons camp in the village of Al-Kammouna, Syria near Turkish border.
