- Talking to Commander Resolute Support Mission in Afghanistan General John Nicholson and US Special Representative for Afghanistan and Pakistan Richard Olson, General Raheel raised the demand of targeting Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) militants and their chief Mullah Fazlullah in their hideouts in Afghanistan.
- Pakistan has told the United States that any drone strikes conducted by the latter in Pakistani territory in the future would be detrimental to the relationship between the two countries.
- 'Making terrorism an excuse for not talking is not justified. We have had good cooperation on Pathankot and even sent a team to India. Blaming us for not doing enough is not justified. It is for India to decide whether they want to break the logjam or not.' Sartaj Aziz said.

International

- Hackers claiming to be from Pakistan defaced websites of seven Indian embassies, high
 commissions, and consulates in various countries with pro-Pakistan Army slogans. In an email
 sent to journalists, the hackers claimed to target Indian missions in Ankara, Athens, and Mexico
 City.
- President Barack Obama has approved giving the US military greater ability to accompany and enable Afghan forces battling a resilient Taliban insurgency, in a move to assist them more proactively on the battlefield, a US official told Reuters.
- More than 22 people were killed and 70 wounded in two separate bombings in Baghdad, one targeting a commercial street and the other an army checkpoint, Iraqi police said.
- UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon has disclosed that he made the "painful and difficult"
 decision to temporarily remove the Saudi-led coalition in Yemen from a blacklist for violating
 child rights because of "undue pressure" from its supporters who threatened to stop funding
 many programmes being run by the global organisation.
